Title of the Course: Social Inclusion for Development

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COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will cover the different dimensions of social exclusion and inclusion, and how e-gov projects can be designed to foster social inclusion. The course will start off by examining the concept of development, the different forms of social exclusion and the impact of exclusion. We look at strategies for fostering social inclusion and the role of affirmative government policies. Next, the information society and ICT for Development (ICT4D) concepts are introduced. Finally we examine case studies of e-gov and ICT4D projects which promote social inclusion.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The specific objectives of this course are

- To sensitize participants to the multi-dimensional aspects of social exclusion.
- To understand how e-governance and Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) can play a role in fostering social inclusion.
- Acquaint participants with the fact that technology is not neutral but can amplify the inherent, invisible exclusions in society.
- Understand how e-governance and ICT4D projects cab be designed to promote inclusion.

PEDAGOGY

The pedagogy will be predominantly lectures and classroom discussions. Plenty of case studies and real-life examples will be discussed to illustrate and reinforce concepts.
